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"RECTITUDE" IS A PERPETUAL VICTORY"**JUVENILE AND CRIME**

People often talk about Juvenile crime and its increase. But little do they reflect upon the amount of thought and labor exerted in this channel by many who are seeking a cure for youth going astray. Many factors must be considered before a boy or girl are branded by the evil eye of society just because they have gone amiss once or twice!

If we were to visit a Juvenile court in Cincinnati, our first impression would soon lead us to conclude that this court is not a court at all, but rather a child welfare agency, where those in charge use every possible aid of religion, medicine, and scientific knowledge, thereby preventing about 80% from becoming second offenders. The reason for this success is due to the outlook of the court and its able Judge, Charles W. Hoffman, who for 30 years has been head of court.

This particular court is more interested in the culprit than in his crime. As every effect must have a cause, so too they seek the reason why this or that individual is at present before the bench. This court seeks to learn the cause for the delinquent's behaviour, and then bring to bear all possible resources to restore the culprit back in society. The home is the first source examined and in most instances, here lies the real source for the outcome: playmates, locality, physical condition, and other factors are examined and then a remedy is applied.

With such an outlook on Juvenile Criminals, the results can be gratifying. A philosophy of cure rather than punishment brought to bear, will not only deter a criminal career, but even educate society that is also to blame for such behaviour as it does not afford juveniles sufficient facilities to team him physically, educationally, and religiously.

An asset to a community would be a formation of a group of teachers, students and professional men who would examine a juvenile culprit, and seek foremost to heal rather than wound. To condemn an offender would only be an incentive for further misdeeds, but in showing the boy or girl how and why they went wrong would stem the tide from evil to good.--We ourselves often brand the individual as bad without reflecting on his or her background. Can we not reflect that the same could happen to us should we have been in his place. Is it the individual or conditions which is responsible? Then, where is the cure??
